She carried out research work among southern Sudanese refugees and internally displaced persons in Egypt, Uganda and southern Sudan. Dr. Edward is the author of *Sudanese Women Refugees: Transformations and Future Imagining*. New York: Palgrave Macmillan, 2007; and several articles that deal with gender issues in conflict situations, the consequences of Sudan's civil war on civilians, and immigrants and refugees' experiences.
